



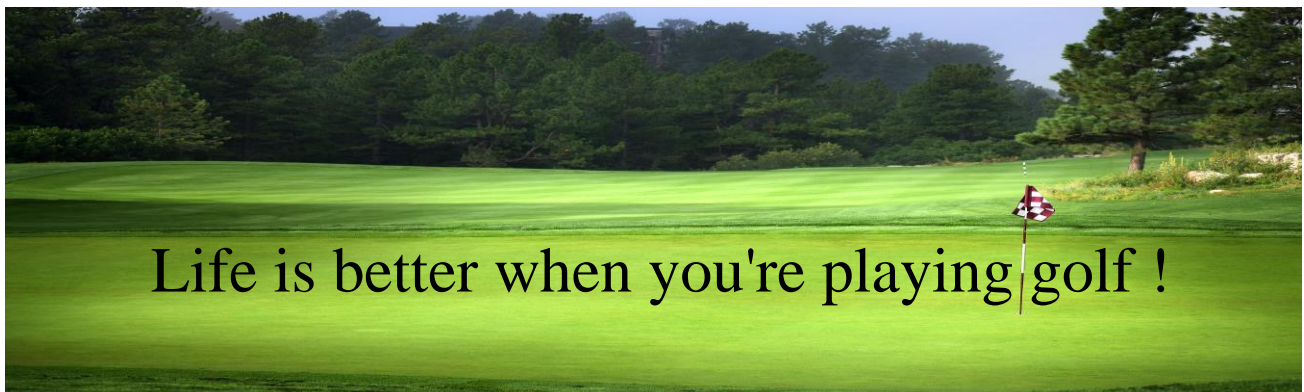
HANDBOOK

TUESDAY MORNING LADIES LEAGUE

The ladies league will start on the first Tuesday of April, and end on the last Tuesday of September.

Eligibility :

Tuesday morning ladies league is open to ALL Glacier Greens ladies regardless of membership category :

- All regular, ordinary and Associate members in Good Standing *
- All introductory, Players Club & Afternoon members including 9-hole members
- Adult female guests of members who have paid the Ladies Guest Green fee
 - * good standing - membership fees are paid

Fees

The Tuesday morning ladies league fees for qualifying members will be as follows. Except for a few special events, these fees cover the cost of our individual weekly and or team prizes, year end prizes and awards, and minimal administration costs.

For ALL Regular, Ordinary and Associate members - 18 hole players

\$35.00 per season plus GST

For ALL regular, ordinary and associate members - 9 hole players

\$20.00 per season plus GST

- to play 18 holes , there will be a \$20 green fee plus tax as well

For Introductory , Afternoon members and Players Club

\$35.00 per season plus GST plus \$20 plus tax green fee payable prior to the game

Invited Guests of members are welcome, or guests approved by the Ladies Coordinator. Guest green fee rates apply and are payable prior to game play, and if the guest wishes she may pay the \$5.00 plus GST drop in fee to participate in weekly prizes.

Junior female golfers are always welcome upon paying applicable green fees and/or drop in fees.

Fees for a full season are to be paid by the 2nd Tuesday in April.

Additional applicable green fees are to be paid prior to the game.

Drop in fees to participate in weekly prizes are to be paid when registering.

Day Of Play - Tuesday mornings

Ladies will gather in the clubhouse Solarium at least 30 minutes prior to the shotgun start time.

Ladies will retrieve their "name/handicap tag" from the GG Ladies cabinet in the washroom and bring it to the registration table, ensuring that the handicap is up to date. At this time the draw and hole assignments will be completed. We do politely request that you be on time.

Tuesday Morning Ladies Games

Blind Partner

A sheet with all the ladies participating will be completed on registration. The names will then be hidden and the players upon turning their score cards in will write their name opposite one of the hidden names. This will be their partner for scoring purposes.

Card Game

The players will decide before teeing off, who will be the Ace, King, Queen, Jack. If you are only a threesome, each player will rotate being the Jack on every 3rd hole (as well as their own designation). Play the hole. ex hole 1 Player A is Jack as well as Ace, Hole 2 Player B is Jack as well as King, Hole 3 Player C is Jack as well as Queen, repeat....

At the next tee box, under the teeblock will be a card..which ever player is this card, then theirs is the score that is recorded for the CARD game score. Their NET score is used. Put the card back where you retrieved it for the next group to use.

Fielders Choice

Prior to play mark on your card with the highlighter 2 x par 3, 5 x par 4s, and 2 x par 5s. At the end of the round these holes will make up your score. Gross and net.

Half and Half

Your score will consist of the front nine putts added to your Back 9 Gross score = Score #1
And then Back nine putts added to your Front 9 Net score = Score #2

Hidden Holes

9 holes will be pulled, but you won't know which ones they are. But they will be the ones used for scoring net and gross.

Pink Ball

Each group will have a pink ball. Golfers rotate as the pink ball player: Golfer A on hole #1, B on #2, C on #3, D on #4, back to A on #5, and so on. The pink ball's score is recorded on the scorecard. If the pink ball gets lost just continue the play with another ball.

Poker Hand

Prior to heading out to the course, Each player will mark with a highlighter 5 holes on their score card. The scores on these 5 holes will make up a poker hand. The best hand wins. Choose wisely.

Portuguese Caddy

During your round you will have 3 opportunities to call on your Portuguese Caddy to help you when your ball may have landed in a less desirable place. You have 3 choices, but may only use each choice once. 1. kick your ball to a new location 2. with your non dominant arm throw your ball to a new location and 3. using your putter - putt your ball to a new location

Red and White Canada Flag Day

- played like a tombstone, Course Par of 71 plus your handicap. ex. 71 plus HC of 20 = 91. After you have reached 91 on your score card, plant your flag. Continue to finish the round so you can enter your full score.

Throw out the 2 Worst and the 2 Best Scores

Tally up your score gross and net, but throw out the 2 worst scores and the 2 best scores

MATCH PLAY

Inter-Club Match Play

Match play is a form of play where a player (or players) plays directly against an opponent (or opponents) a head -to-head match. A hole is one by completing it in the fewest number of strokes and the team who wins the most holes, wins the match

In Inter-Club match play we play in teams of two. Teams accumulate points over the season, and the team with the most points wins the Match Play Event.

6 ladies are needed for each event. Priority is given to those ladies with lowest handicaps.

However, we will try to give everyone who wishes a chance to participate.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF ALL GLACIER GREENS LADY PLAYERS

Handicaps and Recording Scores

A handicap is designed to allow players of differing abilities to play together on an equal basis, but is based on each player accurately recording her scores. Every player is responsible for entering every acceptable score into the computer, in Golf Canada . **PLEASE enter you score HOLE BY HOLE and the computer does the Equitable Stroke conversion.** It listed both your gross score and the Equitable Stroke score and enters your Equitable Stroke when posted. **It is requested that you enter your score after every round within 24 hours.** It keeps the playing field fair for everyone. Adjustment of Hole Scores Rule 3—page 18 (Rules of Handicapping) Acceptable /Unacceptable Score.

"Golf is a game that depends on honesty and integrity."

Acceptable /Unacceptable Scores

Acceptable scores will include all 18 hole and 9 hole games played under the “Rules of Golf”, including those games played as a single player, match play, multi-ball games and tournaments. Scores that include conceded putts are acceptable for handicap purposes and must be included. When temporary greens are in use, provided the length of the course is not significantly altered, these too are considered acceptable scores. Unacceptable scores include those games outside of the regular playing season, from courses or tees that are not RCGA or USGA slope rated or any games not played under the “Rules of Golf”. For more specific information regarding information about handicaps and acceptable/unacceptable scores please refer to the RCGA Rules Handbook, or ask a member of the Rules Committee.

Tournament Scores

The following are considered tournament scores and must be entered as such: Scores from qualifying rounds and any tournament The following are NOT considered tournament scores and should be entered as a regular score: Match play or any regular Ladies club games.

Local Pace of Play

It is understood that “Pace of Play” is an important part of the etiquette of the game. We ask all our members to be very cognizant of this issue. An 18 hole round of golf should take no more than 4:15 hours, and a 9 hole round a total of 2:05 hours. The following are some hints to speed up play:

- ◆ Be aware of your position with regard to the group ahead of you (not just keeping ahead of the group behind)
- ◆ Follow the flight of all tee shots, not just your own. In the fairway, help others look for their ball if you already know the location of yours.
- ◆ Play a provisional ball if you think your ball may be lost outside a hazard or out of bounds.
- ◆ Try to determine your yardage and make club selection before it is your turn to play. Very often you can do this with disruption to other players.
- ◆ Be ready to play as soon as it is your turn to play. If the player whose turn it is to play is not ready— and your are— go ahead if you can do so safely.

- ◆ On the putting green, line up your putt while others are playing without disturbance to others.
- ◆ Move off the green quickly and mark your scorecard at the next hole. If you are the 1st to arrive at the next tee—hit first and then mark your score.
- ◆ If each foursome can speed up their play by 15 seconds per shot, over 18 holes this accumulates into 18 minutes off the time it takes to play the game. This makes a huge difference and your fellow golfers will appreciate a well-paced game.

***Your place on the course is behind the group in front of you,
not in front of the group behind you.***

Knowing the Rules

It is the responsibility of each player to know the rules of golf, but that being said, as a club we are here to help each other learn the intricacies of the game so we encourage everyone to ask questions and clarify the rules at the appropriate time. Our Rules Committee is here to offer advice, provide information or help us all learn through review sessions. If you have questions or want more information, please just ask—we are here to enjoy the game and help each other. Just a reminder to those playing in a tournament, asking for advice may incur a 2 stroke penalty but you are allowed to ask about your options, e.g. “What are my options if my ball is unplayable?” . The opponent can share the options available if they choose. If in doubt always play a second ball for the rest of the hole and ask the rules person for clarification before signing your card at the end of the round.

TOURNAMENTS and ZONE 6 Events

Most courses in the Comox Valley and surrounding communities host Ladies Golf Tournaments throughout the summer. Check the Ladies Bulletin Board for notices or check the Specific Clubs website.

As well Zone 6 Ladies Golf holds several events throughout the season. These can be found by going to their website at : www.bcgazone6.org/women/

AND don't forget the BC 55+ Senior Games and Golf BC, as both host great tournaments..

Remember all you need is a RCGA handicap to enter most events. I urge you to try them out!!!
